

## THE MOUNT WOLF BOROUGH NON-VOTING MEETING

August 26, 2025

The Mount Wolf Council conducted a non-voting Committee meeting on Tuesday, August 26, 2025. The meeting was called to order by Vice President Dennis Naylor at 7:03 pm.

### **ATTENDANCE:**

### **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Dave Heckert reported that his son, Dan, recently received awards for his coaching.

He also raised concerns about the ballfield and the condition of the grass, and that people are using the ballfield and causing damage. A suggestion was made to post signs asking people to be respectful when using the field.

The field will be worked on starting the first weekend of October, so the field will be closed for approximately a month.

Manny Veizquez apologized to Dave Heckert for the words that were exchanged, and he reported on his team's standings, thanking the council for allowing them to use the field. He raised questions regarding his contract. He's going to provide a schedule for renewing his contract. He also stated that he'll come by and work on cleaning up the field.

Blane Bowers' reported that the backhoe leaks. They'll need to investigate to see what the issue is. They cleaned up at 6<sup>th</sup> and Walnut Streets. The mower guy hasn't been in yet to look at the

skag mower. The ladies' toilet has been fixed in the office. There was a new urinal installed at the ballfield. They ordered new detail for the wrong way parking lot sign. They still have some curbs to finish up. Hopefully, by the second week of September, they will be finished. A concern regarding the paint being thin was discussed. A police report was filed about the speed sign that was knocked down near the railroad tracks. Dietz & Nauman are going to check and confirm that the sign is still in working order. Mayor Mo suggested checking with the car lot to see if they have anything on video showing the sign being knocked over.

The vendor event at Bloom Hair salon will not be held this year. They will be planning something in the future, probably next year, and will reach out for permission.

### **MAYOR'S REPORT:**

Mayor Mo reported that she received an email from the York County Planning Commission regarding the new warehouses. She placed a call asking if anything is going to be done because the current infrastructure can't handle all this traffic. She's planning to have a conversation with Dave Naylor.

She sent out a few ordinance letters.

The gas company is replacing meters on Chestnut Street.

She received a complaint about curb damage on 5<sup>th</sup> Street. She'll contact Todd Hess for pictures and then send a letter to Columbia Gas.

### **PARKS AND RECREATION REPORT:**

Dan Schleg reported that he's been getting requests from people to use the pavilion at the park. He asks for a \$25 donation.

He received an email from Holly that Nell is not planning to use the ballfield this fall or next year.

It was discussed that the field should not get overused. The use should be restricted. Home and away games should be split 50/50, which will reduce the amount of wear and tear on the field.

The Oldtimers were told that they cannot use the field in the fall.

### **STREET REPORT:**

Dennis Naylor reported that we don't know when the remaining paving will be completed. There is a large hole that needs to be addressed in the middle of the street in front of Georgia Pacific.

He reported that he got 3 quotes for the scag mower that they are looking to replace. Bob's Outdoor is the lowest price. Purchasing a new mower will be added to the agenda for the next meeting.

He also reported that he researched purchasing a new pickup truck. A truck was found at LB Smith Ford, but Pat Poet did some digging and found out that they didn't reapply for their costar license for trucks. Dennis Naylor received an email that they reapplied for their costar license, which will take about 6 weeks to receive. In the meantime, Dennis Naylor is going to do some more research. Blane Bowers suggested that no matter what is purchased they be sure to get lining in the bed of the truck.

#### **PROPERTY AND SERVICES REPORT:**

The work at the office will be done early next week.

#### **HEALTH AND SAFETY REPORT:**

A police report was filed about the electronic speed sign.

#### **BUDGET AND FINANCES REPORT:**

Jennifer Reiner reported that we are bonded for one million dollars.

Michael Barlett said that it's getting to the time of the year to prepare a budget. He said that he and Jennifer Reiner should get together and print out the necessary paperwork for the next meeting.

#### **PERSONNEL REPORT:**

Pat Poet reported that the Maintenance Job Description should be added to the next agenda. She also requested an executive session following the committee meeting.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Mayor Mo reported that she didn't get the rental property inspections letter.

Pat Poet reported that she called Tabby Trappers regarding feral cats. Their recording stated that they are 3-6 months behind. She asked if we could be added to their list. She's going to keep calling. Blane Bowers is going to check with Jay Hitz about the property owner where cats are entering the garage and having kittens to see if it could be boarded up.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Pat Poet reported that she spoke with a lady at the elections office to get information regarding terms. She was told that it's the council's responsibility to know when terms are up. She's going to call again for more information and find out who's on the ballot.

Dennis Naylor welcomed Larry Murray Jr. to the committee and said that the paperwork needed could be completed and given to the secretary.
