

# THE MOUNT WOLF BOROUGH REGULAR/COMMITTEE MEETING

February 24, 2026

The Mount Wolf Council conducted Regular-Committee meeting on Tuesday, January 27, 2026. The meeting was called to order by President Pat Poet at 7:00 pm.

## **APPROVAL OF AGENDA:**

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Blane Bowers reported on the following:

- Where they will be placing the snow emergency signs and if they are permitted to put them on telephone poles.
- He asked about purchasing a battery powered hedge trimmer.
- He reported that the gas card didn't work at Rutters and they used another credit card. Kimberly Kunkle said that Jennifer Reiner was aware of the issue and is in the process of getting the issue resolved.
- He updated council on the snow plowing.

## **MAYOR'S REPORT:**

Mayor Josh Parish reported on the following:

- He did not marry anyone.
- Ordinance violations – He is waiting for the invoices from Gingerich for the snow removal so we can send letters out
- He received an email from Kim about a dumpster on S 4<sup>th</sup> street. We do not have a permit for it, so we need to contact the company. I asked Kim for the number so I could reach out to them and ask them to get the owner to get a permit or remove the dumpster.
- Citizen complaints – He received a complaint about the trash behind 8 North Main Street in the alley. We need to send a letter to the property owner as the property appears to be vacant presently. The trash appears to be coming from people who rent the back-alley garage from them or the property itself. Either way they should not be littering in the streets.
- Property rental inspection update - Jody at Barry Isett has said the letter is good. He sent it over to Jenn. Jenn will get the letters sent out with assistance from Kim.
- Snow – He was asked by our EMC if we wanted to do a snow emergency. Based on all available information to him and the limited time available he made the decision to not issue a snow emergency. It seems to have worked out just fine.

## **PARKS AND RECREATION REPORT:**

Dan Schleig reported on the following:

- The quote for mulch from Zeager Bros. will stay about the same this year. \$2004 It's typically delivered around the end of March. Altland/McKenna motion to purchase the mulch not to exceed \$2100, motion passed unanimously.
- He received a request from Manny to use both Greiman Park and the Wolves field at Mt. Wolf Park. Schleig/McKenna motion to approve Manny the use of both fields at Greiman Park Monday, Wednesday, Saturday, & Sunday with the contingency that he provides a potty and the equipment, motion passed unanimously. He's going to contact Manny and tell him that he should plan to attend the next council meeting to discuss his request further regarding schedules and the use of the Wolves field at Mt. Wolf Park.
