

Mount Wolf Borough Minutes

Public Meeting

January 24, 2023

Convene:

The Mount Wolf Borough Council held a Public Meeting on Tuesday, January 24, 2023, beginning at 7:02PM. The hearing was called to order by Council President, Darryl Main.

Attendance:

The following Council Members and Officials were present:

Public Comment/Testimony:

1. Mark Carbaugh (103 South 2nd Street)
 - a. Mr. Carbaugh questions Council on how much updating this Ordinance is costing the resident of Mount Wolf Borough. Councilperson Parish stated that the review by York County Planning Commission is free. Councilperson Todd Hess stated that the Municipal Secretary could gather all the invoices and get an exact total. Furthermore, it was explained that having so many Zoning Hearings is likely more costly than updating this Ordinance. The goal is to save money in the long run.
2. Robin Newcomer (103 South 3rd Street)
 - a. Ms. Newcomer asked if Borough Council will be using the recreation fee from Inch & Co towards Mount Wolf Park. Councilperson Denny Naylor answer that it has to be used for that purpose. Ms. Newcomer stated that she heard rumor that the Mount Wolf Park ballfield is being sold. Council answer no, this rumor is false.
3. Howard Daniels (112 North 6th Street)
 - a. Mr. Daniels voiced frustration concerning how people drive on Center Street and the speed they drive. He is worried that with an increase in residents in the Borough due to the new apartment complexes it will just get worse. Mayor Mo informed him that the police department are doing a lot of traffic citation to keep Center Street a safe street and Council is always discussing the safety of Center Street.
4. Anne Nixdorf (95 South 2nd Street)
 - a. Ms. Nixdorf questioned Council concerning the new apartment complexes being building in the Borough and the sewer capacity. Luckily, Pat Poet, the plant manager for NEYCSA was in attendance and answered her questions/concerns.

Mayor Mo thanked all the residents that attended this Public Hearing and meeting. She reminded residents that all meetings are public and all are welcome to attend. She stated that Council cares about this community and is doing their very best to make to keep it a beautiful place to live.
