The Mount Wolf Council conducted a non-voting meeting on Tuesday January 28, 2025. The meeting was called to order by President Darryl Main at 7pm.

### **APPROVAL OF AGENDA:**

The agenda was approved. The borough did receive payment for the “Wolves” baseball team. Payment will be sent to the “Wolves” baseball team.

### **MAYOR’S REPORT:**

Mayor Starner reported that she had a lot of complaints from residents regarding snow emergency. Darryl Main stated that the people who complain regarding the snow emergency are always welcome to attend the meetings and voice their opinion or complaint.

Mayor Starner reported that she had a complaint from a resident stating that they never received any notice from Columbia Gas regarding the work being done in the borough. Mayor Starner stated that she would reach out to Columbia Gas and York Water and state her concerns and the residents' concerns.

Mayor Starner reported that a resident called and stated that people are speeding on Seventh Street and Maple Street. The resident stated that he did call the police regarding the situation of people speeding. The resident was requesting that the Borough to place a speed bump. Mayor Starner reported that she will bring his concern to the Borough Council’s attention. Mayor Starner did inform the resident that he welcome to attend any meeting and voice his concerns.

### **STREET REPORT:**

Dennis Naylor reported that the maintenance workers did a great job with the snow removal. Mayor Starner stated that she heard a lot of compliments from residents regarding the job the maintenance crew did on snow removal.

Darryl Main stated that the snowplow was damaged during the plowing. Darryl Main reported that it was not major damage and the snowplow is repaired. Jennifer Reiner reported that she has not received any bills regarding the damage to the snowplow.

Darryl Main stated that there is a nationwide salt storage.

Dan Schleig stated that he will reach out to the company who supplies the brine for more information.

Darryl Main reported that he got quotes for pick-up trucks for the Borough. Darryl Main stated that the Chevy pick-up truck due to the fact the truck the maintenance crew have now will not pass inspection for next year.

### **PARKS AND RECREATION REPORT:**

Dan Schleig reported that the cable that was ordered for the flagpole was not correct. Jennifer Reiner reported that she did order the correct cable that is needed for the flagpole and should be delivered on February 3, 2025.

Dan Schleig reported that the cameras in the park are fixed.

### **PROPERTY AND SERVICES REPORT:**

Brian McKenna reported that we have not received any quote from the insurance company. The insurance company did response via email to Jennifer Reiner stating that they are still reviewing the claim.

### **BUDGET AND FINANCES REPORT:**

### **HEALTH AND SAFETY REPORT:**

Dan Schleig reported that there was an issue with the police and parents who were dropping off their children at Mount Wolf Elementary School. The parents were blocking the intersection. Mount Wolf Elementary resolved this issue regarding the drop off of the students. With the recent snow fall and lower than normal temperatures, school was delayed 2 hours for 3 days. An incident with a police officer and the parents occurred. The police officer was very unprofessional in handling this matter. The borough council discussed placing "No Parking except for student drop off". Mayor Starner stated that she will bring this to the Police Chief and the next police meeting.

Josh Parish reported that the following personnel will hold office for Eagle Fire Company. Fire Chief, Jacob Bush, 1<sup>st</sup> Assistant Fire Chief, Jimmy Smith, 2<sup>nd</sup> Assistant Fire Chief, Michael Fischer, Captain John Kain, President, Steve Trott, Vice President, John Moramarco.

Josh Parish stated that he did ask the Fire Company for the list of the fundraisers that they have planned for 2025 for Borough approval.

**PERSONNEL REPORT:**

**PRESIDENT'S REPORT:**

Darryl Main stated that he did receive an email stating that the Borough received a fine of \$500.00 from the PUC due to a failure to respond to a PA ONE call from the Borough representative. Darryl Main stated that the Borough will have 30 days to contest the bill. Darryl Main stated that a certified letter will arrive in the mail. Jennifer Reiner stated that as of today, we have not received the certified letter. Josh Parish recommends raising the fee for street openings.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Darryl Main stated that Codification needs to be completed. Darryl Main stated that Codification will be completed by November 2025.

Darryl Main stated that Council will start Rental Property enforcement this year. Darryl Main stated that the Borough will need to create the permit and the invoice and the inspection list. The permit will be through the Borough. Darryl Main stated the Borough will need to go off the criteria that Barry Isett and Company gave us to follow. Darryl Main would like to start this process within 3 months. The rental property inspections for the entire Borough will be completed within a 3-year span.

Darryl Main stated that the Borough will start Sidewalk Enforcement.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Darryl Main stated that the Borough was notified that Pennsylvania DEP that Brunner's Island is submitting an application for a solid waste permit for disposable operations at their location. Brunner's Island would like to make their ash dump bigger. Darryl Main stated if any Council Person would like to attend this meeting it will be held at East Manchester Township Building on Tuesday February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2025, at 10 am. This meeting is not for the public, but for Government officials. A public meeting will be held at a later date.
