

THE MOUNT WOLF BOROUGH REGULAR/COMMITTEE MEETING

March 24, 2026

The Mount Wolf Council conducted Regular-Committee meeting on Tuesday, March 24, 2026. The meeting was called to order by President Pat Poet at 7:00 pm.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

- Purchase of 6 pre-cast pin blocks – Added via Vote of council due to being left off the agenda accidentally. (Motion by Dennis Naylor, Second by Michael Barlett, Voted in favor – Brian McKenna, Larry Murray Jr., Pat Poet, Dennis Naylor, Michael Barlett, and Travis Altland

VISITORS:

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Anya Barlett attended the meeting on behalf of the Sewer Authority. She wanted to discuss the 5 permit applications that were brought to the borough's attention. The locations that will be worked on are different from the ones previously worked on. Waiving of the application fees was also discussed. Council decided to stick with their original decision which is that they must pay the application fees. Pat Poet said that she sees both sides. Kimberly Kunkle reported that we have not received any official paperwork for the permits.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Josh Parish reported on the following:

- He did not marry anyone.
- Ordinance violations – The letters were sent out for the snow removal and junk yard. 3 out of the 5 snow removal fees were paid.
- He attended the police board meeting. The police department is signing a 287(g) agreement. It's an agreement between a police department and immigration & customs enforcement. He recommended that council do their own research on what this agreement means. It could mean that our police officers could be enforcing immigration laws if they encounter something at a traffic stop. He said that the police department felt that by signing this agreement it will allow them to manage their jurisdiction rather than have ICE manage their jurisdiction. There will be training that specific officers will go to for handling immigration and customs enforcement. He said he will stay on top of this to see how it is structured.
- The fire department provided a letter at the last meeting. They would like the council to enter into a contract with them for services. He and Brian are going to meet with them to review the letter and then get Devon's advice before entering into any agreement.

PARKS AND RECREATION REPORT:

The mulch will be in at the end of the month.

Barlett/Altland motion to purchase dog waste bins for existing stations not to exceed \$1200, motion passed unanimously.

DCED – Greenways (GTRP) application will be added to the agenda for the next meeting.

STREET REPORT:

Brian Mckenna is going to tell the maintenance guys that they can proceed with renting a core drill.

Naylor/Barlett motion to purchase 6 pre-cast pin blocks, motion passed unanimously.

Dennis Naylor reported that we are on the docket for street sweeping. Flyers will need to be distributed after dates are confirmed.

Larry Murray reported that Steve Rousher dropped off replacement flags at the funeral home.
